Ascension Day, Thursday, May 9

Please participate in this Ascension Day Eucharist if possible. Ascension Day is a big deal, even though it falls in the middle of the week. Ascension Day is one of the seven Principal Feasts observed in the Episcopal Church, aside Easter Day, the Day of Pentecost, Trinity Sunday, All Saint's Day, Christmas Day, and The Epiphany (*Book of Common Prayer*, *p. 15*). The Ascension is affirmed by the Nicene and Apostles' Creeds.

The Feast of the Ascension marks the taking up of Jesus into heaven. Ascension Day sets forth the mystery that the end of Jesus's resurrection appearances and his being taken from the earth into heaven does not imply his absence from his Church. In fact, because he is now beyond the bounds of time and space and free of their confinement, he is able to be present everywhere at once. A function of Ascension Day, coming toward the end of the Fifty Days of Easter, is to prepare us for the gift of the Holy Spirit, and its message is not complete until the days of the Pentecost have been fulfilled.
